Making the Grade – School Board Duties and Opportunities

In Arizona, the statutory life of a school district governing board member involves everything from approving budgets and building schools to making sure student athletes have water. In reality, school board members serve as advocates for students, parents, and teachers; lobbyists for education issues and funding; and, hopefully, models and inspirations for learning and innovating. Find out what serving on a school board means — and why you should think about running for your local board.

Anne Greenberg is president of the Paradise Valley Unified School District Governing Board, where she was first elected in 2004, and subsequently re-elected in 2008 and 2012. Within the district, one of the 10 largest in the state, Anne has served in numerous volunteer positions, including as a founding member of the Community Legislative Network. She currently chairs the Legislative Committee of the Arizona School Boards Association, which honored her with its All-Arizona School Board Award in 2011, and represented ASBA on the state board of the Arizona Academic Decathlon for six years. The former national president of Women in Communications, Inc., Anne is the

Executive Vice President of Health & Medical Multimedia, a communications firm that creates medical publications and educational programming. She received her Bachelor of Science degree in Journalism from Northwestern University. Anne and her husband, Rick McGuire, are the proud parents of two graduates of Paradise Valley schools.


