She was also the first newswoman in Arizona to be inducted into the Arizona Broadcasters' Hall of Fame. Among her many other awards, she has received the Peabody Award--the most prestigious honor given in broadcasting, thirteen Arizona Press Club Awards for reporting, and the Martin Luther King Living the Dream Award. Mary Jo gives her time, talent, and knowledge to service on the Board of Trustees at the ASU Walter Cronkite School of Journalism and Telecommunications and to the Board of Trustees at Grand Canyon College. She has empowered many women to follow their dreams.

West has also worked in various capacities for the City of Phoenix, the Catholic Diocese, Bashas', St. Vincent de Paul and other organizations. West left full-time work two years ago and is enjoying the role of grandmother, picking up her grandson from school every day. She hesitates to call herself retired because she's still doing freelance projects. "I failed miserably at retirement. I want to do what Mother Teresa did. I want to die on my feet."


She told us to make sure and stay vigilant to the Environment needs. We must make sure to protect our resources.

Mark your calendars! This year's annual Legislative Day will be on Tuesday, February 21<sup>ST</sup>, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:20 p.m. The battle continues regarding funding for education at all levels. This is a great opportunity to have your voice heard at the State Capitol, and to see how the state's business gets done.

This year's focus will again be on education, a topic of concern to so many of us. The morning session will include:

- A panel discussion featuring: Rep. Paul Boyer, Chairman of the House Education Committee, who is a Republican from District 20; Rep. J. D. Mesnard, House Speaker, who is a Republican from District 17; Sen. Sean Bowie, a newly elected Democrat from District 18; and hopefully Katie Hobbs, Senate Minority Leader, who is a Democrat from District 24.
- Short presentations on other issues of high priority for Arizona AAUW.
- An opportunity to meet with our legislative district representatives to personally discuss your areas of concern, if arrangements are made ahead of time.

After a lunch break, we will attend the afternoon legislative session, where AAUW will hopefully be formally recognized from the floor.

Soon you will be receiving an e-mail that provides more information regarding the day's schedule of events and the procedure for setting up appointments with your representatives, and other details about transportation, parking, etc. In the meantime, we invite you to visit the Arizona Legislature website, AZLEG.gov, which has greatly improved in the past year. You can easily find out who your representatives are and access the legislative calendar and information on pending committee meetings and legislation.

STEP 1: Creating an Online Fry's Account

\*NOTE: If you already have an online Fry's account, skip to #2

\*Go to http://www.frysfood.com/

\*Select 'Register'.

\*Under Sign-In information, enter your email and create a password. (Write down your email & password—will need it in step 2)

\*Select 'Use Card Number'.

\*Enter your Fry's V.I.P Card Number, last name and postal code.

\*Under 'Select Your Preferred Store' enter your postal code.

\*Select 'Find Stores'.

\*Choose your store then select 'Create Account'.

\*You will then be prompted to check your email for a confirmation email.

Click the hyperlink in your email to finish creating your Online Fry's Account.

\*Continue to step #2 to register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program of your choice.

STEP 2: Register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program

\*Select 'Sign-In'.

\*Enter your email and password then select 'sign in'. (This will be the email and password you created in step 1)

\*Select 'My Account then select 'Account Settings' from drop down menu.

\*Click 'edit' under Community Rewards. If prompted, enter personal information.

\*Under Find Your Organization: Enter the NPO number or name of organization then select 'search'. (You can get the NPO number from your organization)

\*Under Select Your Organization: Select box next to your organization

\*Then select 'save changes'\*If you have registered correctly, you should now see your organization information listed under 'Community Rewards' on your Account Summary
