



PLEASE NOTE: Before you can link your Fry's V.I.P card to an organization, you must have an email address.

STEP 1: Creating an Online Fry's Account

- *NOTE: If you already have an online Fry's account, skip to #2
- *Go to http://www.frysfood.com/
- *Select 'Register'.
- *Under Sign-In information, enter your email and create a password. (Write down your email & password—will need it in step 2)
- *Select 'Use Card Number'.
- *Enter your Fry's V.I.P Card Number, last name and postal code.
- *Under 'Select Your Preferred Store' enter your postal code.
- *Select 'Find Stores'.
- *Choose your store then select 'Create Account'.
- *You will then be prompted to check your email for a confirmation email.
- Click the hyperlink in your email to finish creating your Online Fry's Account.
- *Continue to step #2 to register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program of your choice.

STEP 2: Register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program

- *Go to https://www.frysfood.com/topic/community?activePage=community-rewards-2
- *Select 'Sign-In'.
- *Enter your email and password then select 'sign in'. (This will be the email and password you created in step 1)
- *Select 'My Account then select 'Account Settings' from drop down menu.
- *Click 'edit' under Community Rewards. If prompted, enter personal information.
- *Under Find Your Organization: Enter the NPO number or name of organization then select 'search'. (You can get the NPO number from your organization)
- *Under Select Your Organization: Select box next to your organization
- *Then select 'save changes'.
- *If you have registered correctly, you should now see your organization information listed under 'Community Rewards' on your Account Summary page.

AAUW Phoenix Branch Abbreviated Board Meeting Minutes -- December 2, 2015

<u>Fundraising – Brunch and other:</u> G. Peniska reported that a date for the Spring Brunch is still pending. The entertainment for the Brunch has not yet been finalized. Discussion followed regarding how to raise more funds for scholarships, since the brunch is our main fundraising activity. Other branches charge more for their fundraising events and have more members involved in the process. The Board expressed a preference for doing the traditional Spring Brunch rather than an author's lunch. Those who attend (and those who cannot attend) the Brunch and the monthly dinners will be encouraged to make a donation to the scholarship fund.

Deborah Spotts will give us scholarship donation cards and envelopes which we can distribute at the Brunch. S. Zeigler had previously given her some of our branch publicity fliers, which she has put in the school lounge.

<u>Membership/Reservations</u>: S. Zeigler, in absentia, expressed concern that some members are making reservations for the dinners and not showing up, and also not paying for the dinner that was reserved for them. She suggested we begin charging quarterly for the dinners. After some discussion, the Board decided to continue with the current system.

<u>Programs:</u> D. Ward has arranged for a speaker for our April general meeting. Jack Burns, Arizona Public Affairs Specialist for the Social Security Administration, will speak on the subject of Social Security Solvency.

G. Peniska reported that her granddaughter, Fiona Lowe, a student at Ironwood High School, is having difficulty in finding a venue to display her photographs, as required for a school project. She asked the Board for permission to display the photographs at the December general meeting. The Board granted approval and also suggested that the membership should be encouraged to display their artwork, and other projects, at future meetings.

<u>Publicity:</u> M. Schiedat has sent out publicity for the January general meeting. The speaker will be Linda Hallman, who is the chief officer at National AAUW. Phoenix City Council member Kate Gallego will speak at the February general meeting, if her schedule permits.

<u>Phoenix College:</u> Deborah Spotts reported that our scholarship check went to the Scholarship Foundation. For the scholarship money to be tax deductible it has to go through the Foundation, which is a 501(c)3 organization. The scholarship money then goes to the student's account. Any excess amount goes to a debit card to be used by the student for miscellaneous expenses. Deborah indicated that for the last few years all scholarship applications for Phoenix College have been in a single on-line system.

<u>Scholarship:</u> The Scholarship Committee reviewed the applications individually, but came to the same conclusion regarding the selection for this year's candidates. The introduction of the scholarship candidates will be at the January general meeting.

<u>For the Good of AAUW:</u> B. Presler is looking for members to attend the January ICC meeting. AAUW will be recognized and will have an opportunity to talk about branch activities. It will be held on January 9 at 11:30 a.m. at Karsten Golf Club.

- B. Presler also requested that a nominating committee be formed, to meet in January to select a slate of candidates for next year's open Board positions. She asked the Board to be ambassadors, seeking out members to be in leadership positions.
- B. Presler reported that Legislative Day will be on February 23, 2016.
