Previous watchdog projects have included continuing coverage of the state's budget crisis of 2008-2011, a critical look at new arsenic standards and an examination of the loopholes and exemptions that riddle Arizona's tax code.

Mary Jo lives in central Phoenix and she is the current caretaker for a home in one of Phoenix's historic neighborhoods. Mary Jacobson Palsma, 73, passed away peacefully on May 15, 2015. She received her BS and MS in Secondary Education from Northern State University in Aberdeen, SD. She and her husband Wayne married in December 1967 and moved to Phoenix, AZ in 1972. Their son Robert was born in November 1973. She spent 28 years teaching mathematics and English at Bourgade Catholic High School in Phoenix and was very active mentoring student clubs, organizing the semi-annual Blood Drive, and supporting the School and students in so many ways. She was a member of AAUW for over 50 years and one time Phoenix Branch president. Some of her greatest passions were playing bridge and traveling. She chaperoned countless student trips to Europe and traveled the rest of the world after she retired. With sad hearts and lots of tears we said good bye to our beautiful, gracious, kind Mary on Saturday, May 23, 2015. June 22, 1937 - May 14, 2015



77, of Phoenix passed away on May 14, 2015. She graduated from Oneonta Teachers College and taught elementary school in the Albany school system for a few years. Looking for a change and more opportunities, she moved to Tucson, Arizona to teach and attended the University of Arizona to earn her Master's degree in Education. Sylvia also taught in Ray, Arizona, a small rural mining community in Pinal County that no longer exists. While attending the UofA, through mutual friends, she met her future husband, Leon Ulan. They married in 1962. Soon children came along, Deborah born in 1963 and Paul in 1967. Sylvia worked the family business as a licensed insurance agent and real estate broker side by side with Leon. She also served as the office manager and bookkeeper. Dedicated to her community, Sylvia was an active member of Temple Emanuel and was a proud member of its Sisterhood. She also volunteered with the Girl Scouts, PTA and attended classes for a Masters in Judaic Studies. In 1981 the family moved to Scottsdale and Sylvia started her involvement with the Phoenix chapter of National Council of Jewish Women where she would serve in all capacities including president. She also volunteered with Women in Community Service, Church Women United and Brandies. Sylvia had a love for books and reading that she shared with her children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews and family friends. When she moved back to Tucson she combined her love for books and community involvement when she chaired the first Tucson Brandeis book and author luncheon, an event that continues to this day. PLEASE NOTE: Before you can link your Fry's V.I.P card to an organization, you must have an email address.

STEP 1: Creating an Online Fry's Account

*NOTE: If you already have an online Fry's account, skip to #2

*Go to http://www.frysfood.com/

*Select 'Register'.

*Under Sign-In information, enter your email and create a password. (Write down your email & password—will need it in step 2)

*Select 'Use Card Number'.

*Enter your Fry's V.I.P Card Number, last name and postal code.

*Under 'Select Your Preferred Store' enter your postal code.

*Select 'Find Stores'.

*Choose your store then select 'Create Account'.

*You will then be prompted to check your email for a confirmation email.

Click the hyperlink in your email to finish creating your Online Fry's Account.

*Continue to step #2 to register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program of your choice.

STEP 2: Register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program

*Go to https://www.frysfood.com/topic/community?activePage=community-rewards-2

*Select 'Sign-In'.

*Enter your email and password then select 'sign in'. (This will be the email and password you created in step 1)

*Select 'My Account then select 'Account Settings' from drop down menu.

*Click 'edit' under Community Rewards. If prompted, enter personal information.

*Under Find Your Organization: Enter the NPO number or name of organization then select 'search'. (You can get the NPO number from your organization)

*Under Select Your Organization: Select box next to your organization

*Then select 'save changes'.

*If you have registered correctly, you should now see your organization information listed under 'Community Rewards' on your Account Summary page.
