The Speaker for the Branch AAUW March meeting is Jessica Doane of Fresh Start.



Jessica Doane is the Program Coordinator for Volunteers and Outreach at Fresh Start Women's Foundation. The mission of Fresh Start is to empower women to transform their lives through engagement and education. We fulfill this mission through the programs and services offered at the Jewell McFarland Lewis-Fresh Start Women's Resource Center in central Phoenix, including education, mentoring, career services, family law services, information and referral, and self-esteem services.

Jessica started as an intern with Fresh Start in July 2012 and began her current position in September 2013. She has experience in event planning, communications, conflict resolution, and leadership.

She has her Associate in Arts through Mesa Community College and will be receiving her Bachelors of Science in Human Services through the University of Phoenix in May 2014.

### **About Fresh Start Women's Center**

Fresh Start focuses on three core values: economic self-sufficiency, personal development and education. The Jewell McFarland Lewis Fresh Start Women's Resource Center offers counseling, mentoring, education, career services, legal services, child watch, an E-Learning center and personal development services that include wardrobing sessions, makeovers and empowerment classes.

Fresh Start also offers services in the East Valley at the Goodwill Career Center in Chandler and has classes available for free online at www.freshstartwomen.org. All of Fresh Start's services are free or low cost and are available to any woman over the age of 18.

### Founders Pat Petznick and Beverly Stewart



Even as young teens, Pat and Beverly wanted to help women, who like their grandmother, suddenly became the sole support of their families. Over the years, the Arizona natives became ardent community activists on behalf of women. In 1992, Pat Petznick and Beverly Stewart were in a position to personally and professionally reach out to women in need. The initial offering was a day of pampering at Rolf's Salon, then co-owned by Pat, Beverly and Rolf Lohse. The women theorized that a new hair style and personalized make-up were immediate ways to boost one's confidence and increase self-esteem. Each month 20 women from shelters and social service agencies were invited to "A Fresh Start Day of Beauty at Rolf's." This core Fresh Start service remains in place today through Rolf's Salon as well as through the Personal Development Room at the Foundation's Women's Resource Center.




### **Morning Book Discussion**


### **Board Meeting**

## NATIONAL WOMEN'S HISTORY PROJECT CELEBRATING WOMEN of CHARACTER, COURAGE & COMMITMENT



#### **Local Celebrations**

As recently as the 1970's, women's history was virtually an unknown topic in the K-12 curriculum or in general public consciousness. To address this situation, the Education Task Force of the Sonoma County (California) Commission on the Status of Women initiated a "Women's History Week" celebration for 1978. The week March 8th, International Women's Day, was chosen as the focal point of the observance.

#### **Mobilizing a Movement**

In 1979, Molly Murphy MacGregor was invited to participate in The Women's History Institute at Sarah Lawrence College, which was chaired by noted historian, Gerda Lerner and attended by the national leaders of organizations for women and girls.

### **Presidential and Congressional Support**

The first steps toward success came in February 1980 when President Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation declaring the Week of March 8th 1980 as National Women's History Week. In the same year, Representative Barbara Mikulski, who at the time was in the House of Representatives, and Senator Orrin Hatch co-sponsored a Congressional Resolution for National Women's History Week 1981. This co-sponsorship demonstrated the wide-ranging political support for recognizing, honoring, and celebrating the achievements of American women.

### **National Women's History Month**

By 1986, 14 states had already declared March as Women's History Month. This momentum and state-by-state action was used as the rational to lobby Congress to declare the entire month of March 1987 as National Women's History Month. In 1987, Congress declared March as National Women's History Month in perpetuity. A special Presidential Proclamation is issued every year which honors the extraordinary achievements of American women.
