The Speaker is Sister Adele O'Sullivan Founder and President of Circle the City



Circle the City is a 501 (c) (3) public charity founded by Sister Adele O'Sullivan, CSJ, M.D., as a result of her work as a physician provider with the Health Care for the Homeless (HCH) Program in Phoenix, Arizona. A member of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet since 1968, Sister Adele sees her medical work with Phoenix's homeless population as a calling that is directly in keeping with the mission of her community to "engage in works of compassion and mercy that respond to the spiritual and corporal needs of persons in our times."

From 1996 to 2009, Sister Adele provided primary health care to homeless patients all over the Valley. During those years, she successfully appealed to her community, and other faith communities and individuals throughout Phoenix, for the seed money to help address the unmet needs of this population. Over the years, monetary donations kept in a shoebox gave way to a bank account as the generosity of the community came forth.

Sister Adele's community fully embraced her work on behalf of homeless persons, and it is from these humble beginnings that Circle the City was born. With the assistance of an Advisory Board formed in September 2007, Circle the City incorporated in March 2008 and has been recognized by the IRS since that time as a tax-exempt public charity.

Between 2008 and 2012 the organization continued its mission of assisting homeless persons during times of illness by addressing unmet needs. These needs were as varied as medical care and imaging studies, vision exams and glasses, travel funds, rent and utility assistance. But while providing these services, the organization steadily worked toward the accomplishment of Circle the City's main goal: the establishment of Arizona's first Medical Respite Center for homeless persons.

In the fall of 2011, through a partnership with Hospice of the Valley, Circle the City acquired the building at 333 W. Indian School Rd. in Phoenix. Construction began in the spring of 2012, and the building was finished in September. On September 28, 2012, Phoenix celebrated the opening of its first Medical Respite Center, where homeless men and women will be able to recover from illness or injury in an atmosphere of dignity and respect, receiving all the services they need to move on to healthy independent living. Since opening its doors, Circle the City has served more than 180 patients and partnered with more than a dozen healthcare facilities throughout the Valley.

We will be accepting donations to Circle the City, cash or check (tax deductible) or grooming products.





Eight AAUW Phoenix Branch Members Attended AAUW Day at the Legislature

Co-President Barbara Presler, Sara Presler, Dot Fields, Barbara Bailey, Dorothy Ward, Sybil Eppinger, Suzanne Petersen, and Sharon Kurtz along with seventy-five other AAUW members from around the State heard about numerous bills that are pending in the legislature.

AAUW of Arizona stressed three points for us to talk about with our Legislators:

- <u>Advocate for adequate and equitable funding for quality public education</u> <u>for all students</u>. We respectfully urge the Legislature to treat education as a ticket to a better future for everyone and not as a political football.
- 2. <u>Opposes the use of public funds and diverted tax credit monies for non-public elementary and</u> <u>secondary education and to charter schools that do not adhere to the same civil rights and transparent</u> <u>operational standards as required of other schools</u>.
- 3. <u>Advocates for the implementation of Arizona's College and Career Ready Standards.</u> When Ted Simon did a survey asking "Are you in favor of Common Core?" 58% were against. When people were given a description of Common Core, 68% were in favor.

Brandi Reyes, our 2015 Phoenix College scholarship recipient, was introduced at our February membership meeting. Brandi is an education major at the College, has two children, and plans to become a teacher and ultimately a principal. PLEASE NOTE: Before you can link your Fry's V.I.P card to an organization, you must have an email address.

STEP 1: Creating an Online Fry's Account

*NOTE: If you already have an online Fry's account, skip to #2

*Go to http://www.frysfood.com/

*Select 'Register'.

*Under Sign-In information, enter your email and create a password. (Write down your email & password—will need it in step 2)

*Select 'Use Card Number'.

*Enter your Fry's V.I.P Card Number, last name and postal code.

*Under 'Select Your Preferred Store' enter your postal code.

*Select 'Find Stores'.

*Choose your store then select 'Create Account'.

*You will then be prompted to check your email for a confirmation email.

Click the hyperlink in your email to finish creating your Online Fry's Account.

*Continue to step #2 to register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program of your choice.

STEP 2: Register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program

*Go to https://www.frysfood.com/topic/community?activePage=community-rewards-2 *Select 'Sign-In'.

*Enter your email and password then select 'sign in'. (This will be the email and password you created in step 1)

*Select 'My Account then select 'Account Settings' from drop down menu.

*Click 'edit' under Community Rewards. If prompted, enter personal information.

*Under Find Your Organization: Enter the NPO number or name of organization then select 'search'. (You can get the NPO number from your organization)

*Under Select Your Organization: Select box next to your organization *Then select 'save changes'.

*If you have registered correctly, you should now see your organization information listed under 'Community Rewards' on your Account Summary page.
