Vicki Hill, Phoenix's City Prosecutor as of March 2016



Hill's background includes more than 20 years' experience in municipal law specializing in police body camera technology, behavioral health cases and domestic violence.

Most recently Hill has been the city's Acting Prosecutor but has held a variety of roles in the City Attorney's Office since 1994. Highlights include being part of a team who implemented specialty courts that focus on key issues such as behavioral health, serving as a leader on the city's Human Trafficking Task Force and participating in the West Phoenix Revitalization Violence Impact Project which addressed prostitution and criminal behavior in a targeted area of the city. In addition, Hill has become a national expert representing Phoenix on the topic of body worn cameras for police officers.

"Ms. Hill has represented the city of Phoenix by successfully overseeing thousands of cases that have achieved accountability for perpetrators while supporting victims in our community," said Ed Zuercher, Phoenix City Manager.

"I am grateful for this exciting opportunity to permanently lead the prosecutor's office and continue our commitment to assist victims, witnesses and their families affected by crime," said Hill. "It's an honor to be part of the city's legal team that is known for the fair administration of justice."

Hill graduated with a Juris Doctor from Creighton University School of Law in Omaha and a Bachelor of Arts in English from Arizona State University.

*Under 'Select Your Preferred Store' enter your postal code.

*Select 'Find Stores'.

*Choose your store then select 'Create Account'.

*You will then be prompted to check your email for a confirmation email.

Click the hyperlink in your email to finish creating your Online Fry's Account.

*Continue to step #2 to register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program of your choice.

STEP 2: Register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program

*Enter your email and password then select 'sign in'. (This will be the email and password you created in step 1)

*Select 'My Account then select 'Account Settings' from drop down menu.

*Click 'edit' under Community Rewards. If prompted, enter personal information.

*Under Find Your Organization: Enter the NPO number or name of organization then select 'search'. (You can get the NPO number from your organization)

*Under Select Your Organization: Select box next to your organization

*Then select 'save changes'*If you have registered correctly, you should now see your organization information listed under 'Community Rewards' on your Account Summary
