The General Meeting is Tuesday, May 19th Dinner 5:30PM, Presentation 6:30PM The Speaker is Daryl Melvin, P.E., CEO of Ft. Yuma Health and a Board member of the Hopi Education Endowment Fund



Daryl Melvin currently serves as CEO of Ft. Yuma Health. Prior to this, he served as CEO for Hopi Health and serves on the Boards of HEEF, NACA, and the Living Treasure Awards. As a non-gaming tribe, the Hopi Tribe derives a majority of its revenue from natural resources located on the 1.8 million acre reservation. The revenue source, coal, is not only finite but also precarious from year-to-year as the revenue is calculated based on the amount mined. The impending closure of the Mohave Generating station and lease negotiation with the coal supplier, Peabody Coal Company, became reality when operations ceased on December 31, 2005.

With values instilled through traditional teachings, Hopi tribal leaders today still follow the visions of leaders before them as each has an aspiration to ensure educational opportunities will continue to exist for the Hopi people. Recognizing education as a high priority the Hopi Tribe knew the need to provide a secure source of funds for education. In November of 2000, the Hopi Tribal council set that vision in motion. Through tribal law, Ordinance #54, and as a form of community investment, the Tribal Council created the fund by allocating the first gift of \$10 million dollars from tribal coffers into the perpetually endowed fund: The Hopi Education Endowment Fund (HEEF). The ordinance also established the HEEF as a 7871(a) charitable, nonprofit public benefit program for educational programs and purposes of the Hopi Tribe. As outlined in Ordinance #54 the main purposes of the HEEF are to provide perpetual funding for: Financial assistance to Hopi students of all ages; Educational research; Educational Programs; and Charitable and Educational Activities.





PLEASE NOTE: Before you can link your Fry's V.I.P card to an organization, you must have an email address.

STEP 1: Creating an Online Fry's Account

\*NOTE: If you already have an online Fry's account, skip to #2

\*Go to http://www.frysfood.com/

\*Select 'Register'.

\*Under Sign-In information, enter your email and create a password. (Write down your email & password—will need it in step 2)

\*Select 'Use Card Number'.

\*Enter your Fry's V.I.P Card Number, last name and postal code.

\*Under 'Select Your Preferred Store' enter your postal code.

\*Select 'Find Stores'.

\*Choose your store then select 'Create Account'.

\*You will then be prompted to check your email for a confirmation email.

Click the hyperlink in your email to finish creating your Online Fry's Account.

\*Continue to step #2 to register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program of your choice.

STEP 2: Register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program

\*Go to <u>https://www.frysfood.com/topic/community?activePage=community-rewards-2</u> \*Select 'Sign-In'.

\*Enter your email and password then select 'sign in'. (This will be the email and password you created in step 1)

\*Select 'My Account then select 'Account Settings' from drop down menu.

\*Click 'edit' under Community Rewards. If prompted, enter personal information.

\*Under Find Your Organization: Enter the NPO number or name of organization then select 'search'. (You can get the NPO number from your organization)

\*Under Select Your Organization: Select box next to your organization

\*Then select 'save changes'.

\*If you have registered correctly, you should now see your organization information listed under 'Community Rewards' on your Account Summary page.
