He will discuss **PROJECT FIRELIGHT, AN EFFORT TO MAKE THE SPIELBERG STORY PART OF OUR ARIZONA IDENTITY**.

One of the greatest stories in Arizona history is about a Phoenix boy who, Tom Sawyer-like, gathered up all the children in the neighborhood and put them to work not whitewashing a fence - but making his movies. Steven Spielberg may be the most accomplished person to ever come from Arizona, but we scarcely recognize his connection to our state. The story of his Phoenix childhood is magnificent and can provide enduring inspiration for future generations of Arizonans if we will only start to tell it. Project Firelight is a now 2-year-old effort to make that story part of our Arizona identity.

As director of the newspaper's Community Leadership department, he oversees the editorial board and manages the institutional voice of the newspaper. Before that, he was editor of The Republic's Sunday Viewpoints section and editor of its Community editorial pages. Earlier in his career he was metro editor at The East Valley Tribune and a reporter at the Los Angeles Daily News. He is a graduate of Brigham Young University and is married with four children. He and his family live in Gilbert, Arizona.

Bylaws Amendment Vote

The AAUW Board of Directors <u>has put three proposals</u> for bylaws amendments before the membership to be voted on this spring. Members will receive their voter PINs via email in April and with the spring *AAUW Outlook* magazine, which will be mailed to members without registered email addresses and to those that have requested to receive *Outlook* in the mail. The comment period closes March 22 at 11:59 p.m. ET, and voting opens April 25.

The AAUW National Board of Directors has voted to put three proposals for bylaws amendments before the membership for a vote this spring. The board strongly supports the proposed amendments that we believe will help keep AAUW vital as an organization and enable us to increase our impact in advancing equity for women and girls.

The proposed amendments address 1. creating threeyear staggered board terms, 2. opening board service to those outside of the AAUW membership, and 3. eliminating the degree requirement for membership. While rationale and details for each proposed amendment can be found on the AAUW website, the overarching motivation for these changes at this time is to uphold and advance AAUW's mission and ensure optimal execution at the national board level.

The first two proposals would bring AAUW's board governance structure more in line with nationally accepted nonprofit best practices and the needs of the organization. The third proposal — to eliminate the degree requirement for membership — has come before the membership for vote a number of times. The board feels strongly that while the degree requirement made perfect sense at AAUW's inception, this requirement is now perceived by many as counter to our mission and limits our ability to build the capacity needed to increase our impact as an organization.

NATIONAL DUES INCREASE

The AAUW Board of Directors voted in June 2017 to enact the first dues change in almost a decade. Effective March 16, 2018, national dues will increase from \$49 to \$59.

Annual dues currently account for 13 percent of AAUW's annual budget. They help to sustain and grow AAUW's programs and work that advances equity for women and girls. A combination of dues, donations, and corporate and foundation funding is critical to supporting AAUW's salary negotiation workshops, groundbreaking research, advocacy efforts, campus leadership programs, and so much more.

We believe we can do great things together and thank you for your continued support.

PHOENIX BRANCH DUES DECREASE

As explained, National AAUW has increased dues by \$10. Treasurer Debra Devault, and Membership VP Mary Beth Lemons, worked to determine what could be cut from our budget. 



*Select 'Find Stores'.

*Choose your store then select 'Create Account'.

*You will then be prompted to check your email for a confirmation email.

Click the hyperlink in your email to finish creating your Online Fry's Account.

*Continue to step #2 to register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program of your choice.

STEP 2: Register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program

*Go to <u>https://www.frysfood.com/topic/community?activePage=community-rewards-2</u> *Select 'Sign-In'.

*Enter your email and password then select 'sign in'. (This will be the email and password you created in step 1)

*Select 'My Account then select 'Account Settings' from drop down menu.

*Click 'edit' under Community Rewards. If prompted, enter personal information.

*Under Find Your Organization: Enter the NPO number or name of organization then select 'search'. (You can get the NPO number from your organization)

*Under Select Your Organization: Select box next to your organization

*Then select 'save changes'*If you have registered correctly, you should now see your organization information listed under 'Community Rewards' on your Account Summary
