Constantin Querard is the founder and president of Grassroots Partners, LLC, a political consulting and public affairs firm. That means he spends most of his time getting people elected to office, and some of his time working on issues he believes in. Constantin has been active in Arizona and Colorado politics for more than two decades, working on a variety of campaigns and causes. He has managed and worked on campaigns for candidates from the City and State Legislative level up to the U.S. Senate and even Presidential level. In 2013, Campaigns & Elections magazine named him one of Arizona's 5 GOP Influencers, and in 2015 he was named Best Campaign Consultant by the Arizona Capitol Times. Constantin also founded the Arizona Family Project, an Arizona non-profit focused on involving Arizona's families in the public policy process, and he served as the organization's Executive Director for several years. He has been a member of the National Association of Republican Campaign Professionals and of Mensa.



PLEASE NOTE: Before you can link your Fry's V.I.P card to an organization, you must have an email address.

- STEP 1: Creating an Online Fry's Account
- *NOTE: If you already have an online Fry's account, skip to #2
- *Go to http://www.frysfood.com/
- *Select 'Register'.
- *Under Sign-In information, enter your email and create a password. (Write down your email & password—will need it in step 2)
- *Select 'Use Card Number'.
- *Enter your Fry's V.I.P Card Number, last name and postal code.
- *Under 'Select Your Preferred Store' enter your postal code.
- *Select 'Find Stores'.
- *Choose your store then select 'Create Account'.
- *You will then be prompted to check your email for a confirmation email.

 Click the hyperlink in your email to finish creating your Online Fry's Account.
- *Continue to step #2 to register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program of your choice.

STEP 2: Register for the Fry's Community Rewards Program

- *Go to https://www.frysfood.com/topic/community?activePage=community-rewards-2
- *Select 'Sign-In'.
- *Enter your email and password then select 'sign in'. (This will be the email and password you created in step 1)
- *Select 'My Account then select 'Account Settings' from drop down menu.
- *Click 'edit' under Community Rewards. If prompted, enter personal information.
- *Under Find Your Organization: Enter the NPO number or name of organization then select 'search'. (You can get the NPO number from your organization)
- *Under Select Your Organization: Select box next to your organization
- *Then select 'save changes'*If you have registered correctly, you should now see your organization information listed under 'Community Rewards' on your Account Summary
