Robert J. McWhirter is a nationally and internationally known speaker and author on trial advocacy, immigration law, and the history of the bill of rights. He is a frequent guest on *Arizona Horizon* and *KJZZ* as a Constitutional expert and historian.


The American Bar Association has published Mr. McWhirter's book BILLS, QUILLS, AND STILLS: THE HISTORY OF THE BILL OF RIGHTS (working title) in 2014 and his books THE CRIMINAL LAWYER'S GUIDE TO IMMIGRATION LAW: QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS, 2nd Ed. 2006 and THE CITIZENSHIP FLOWCHART, 2007. In the 2010 United States Supreme Court case of *Padilla v. Kentucky* Justice Alito extensively quoted from his book. Mr. McWhirter has served on the American Bar Association Criminal Justice Section and on the Standard Committee writing the CRIMINAL JUSTICE STANDARDS.

Mr. McWhirter has extensively taught in Latin America on comparative criminal procedure and trial advocacy in Venezuela, Colombia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Ecuador, and Uruguay and has been a visiting professor at the Catholic University of Chile and the University of Chile. In 2010-2011, Mr. McWhirter served in El Salvador administering an \$11 million USAID project to reform the justice system where he successfully developed and oversaw programs and trainings for the Salvadoran courts, police, prosecutors, and public defenders. Mr. McWhirter still travels to Latin America, in August 2013 on a lecture tour as a speaker grant recipient for the United States State Department and in Uruguay training prosecutors. Most recently he trained lawyers in Puebla Mexico.

In 2009, Mr. McWhirter was named a Southwest Super Lawyer, a rare instance for a public defender. Mr. McWhirter is also a 2016 Distinguished Alumni Award recipient from the *Barrett Honors Collage*. He received the Frank X. Gordon Award for Excellence in the Practice of Law, *Mohave County Bar Association* in 2013 and the Saint Thomas More Award, *Saint Thomas More Society* in 2010. Mr. McWhirter has been a president of *Arizona Attorney's for Criminal Justice*.

From March 2014 until July 2016, Mr. McWhirter was the supervising criminal attorney at the ASU Alumni Law Group, a teaching law firm serving underserved clients. Mr. McWhirter has been elected to serve on the State Bar of Arizona Board of Governors

Mr. McWhirter continues his private practice in criminal defense and testifies and provides expert advice on Immigration Consequences of Criminal Conviction and citizenship issues.

Thank you for your consideration of this request.




PLEASE NOTE: Before you can link your Fry's V.I.P card to an organization, you must have an email address.

- STEP 1: Creating an Online Fry's Account
